Audience

- Who is this piece being written for?
- What is the intended impact on readers?
- Will they understand the terminology?

Purpose:

- In your opinion, what is the purpose of the paper/presentation?
- Is the purpose clear from the beginning?
- How does the content support the purpose of this piece?
- Are there aspects of the piece that undermine the purpose? If so, what are they?

Flow & Voice

- How does the content flow/transition smoothly from one point to the next?
- Does the voice of the author compliment the intended audience and purpose? Why or why not?

Technical

- Are there areas that need additional information or clarification?
- Are there any sections that could be made more concise without sacrificing clarity or depth?
- Are there any overly complex or jargon-heavy sentences that could be simplified?
- Is the writing free of grammatical or spelling errors?

Safety

• What aspects of the piece do you want to flag for the author in consideration of their safety and privacy as a person with lived experience?
